Jo was diagnosed with Parkinson's aged 47 and aged 54 underwent Deep Brain Stimulation to help manage her symptoms.

She is a national and international advocate for Parkinson's, sharing her journey on her social media platforms.

Jo regularly collaborates with Parkinson's UK and she is an active member of the patient advisory board at Boston Scientific.

Her achievements as a public speaker have resulted in her being awarded the Mo Mowlam award, and Inspiring Others Award at the Redcar & Cleveland Inspiring Women Awards 2023.
